## **Huge Progress:**

7/2/10 State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) process complete and formal Determination of Non-Significance (DNS) received from Pierce County (PALS). 14 day comment period ends 7/16/10 followed by 14 day appeal period ending 7/30/10. No comments received by PALS as of 7/15/10.

9/9/10 at 9:00 am is the scheduled Public Hearing. Please attend and encourage others as your presence is needed at the meeting. Location: 2401 South 35<sup>th</sup> St., Tacoma, WA 98409. Room to be determined.

### We are working on:

Follow-up tasks on the WA Dept. of Fish & Wildlife (WDFW) Hydraulic Permit Application (HPA). A complete application package was submitted to Gina Piazza and Don Nauer 3/19/10. Formal HPA 45 day processing timeframe unable to start until SEPA process complete (7/2/10) which we have requested they confirm.

Follow-up tasks on the PALS Site Development permit. The PALS engineering group will soon provide any drawing clarification changes they need. 7/14/10 PALS communicated there are no significant issues in the CRR site development submittal contents.

## Costs are on track to the revised budget:

This CRR shoreline stabilization project will not exceed the original budget of \$1.1 million. There is no projection ahead for any additional funds to complete the 14 buried rock vanes including land restoration work.
